As more activities resume, the branch Demonstration Team is also getting busier. In April, we were invited to perform at Highland Oaks Elementary School in Arcadia for their spring family festival fund-raiser.

There were lots of activity booths to raise money for each classroom, along with community booths with officers and Explorer scouts from police, fire, and mountain rescue services. The food booths were not just fair food (like hot dogs, cotton candy and soft taco plates), but other home-style dishes unfamiliar to us but familiar to the families.

As a large part of the school population is either Asian or Pacific Islander, it's possible that some of them were not familiar with Scottish dance and may never have heard bagpipes. Tress Maksimuk, a Dark Isle bagpiper, joined us after John Cahill, our resident bagpiper, retired from performing after the Burns Ball.

Tress and our director, Roberta Gotfried, worked out a program that alternated her piping with our dancing, and she piped as we marched on and off. She won over the youngsters when she played the main theme of Star Wars on her pipes.

We had a bit of a challenge dancing on a

platform that was only 12 feet wide, and 8 inches above the ground, with no step. We had practiced for several weeks with marks on the rehearsal floor to help us keep the set narrow, but once the music started, we were in full dance mode!

This was also the debut of Bill Hartung, our newest team member. Not content to just dance, teach and play Scottish music on the guitar, Bill has taken on the additional challenge of demonstration dancing. We are very happy to welcome him to the men's side of the set.

Now, it's on to preparations for one of our favorite demonstrations, the Home for Members of the British Empire in Sierra Madre. This is another spring fund-raiser, which we happily join for the scrumptious British baked goods, jewelry, crafts and recycled book sales.
