EILEEN GRAY

In 1985, Eileen Gray's son and daughter-in-law brought her to watch a new Scottish country dance class in Santa Barbara. She came back without them the following week, and didn't stop dancing for 32 years.



A devoted member and later teacher of the class, Eileen is rarely missing in photos from those years: annual Santa Barbara Scottish Society Burns nights, Seaside Games, tea danc-

es, St. Patrick's Day dances and other parties.

Eileen stepped up to lead the Santa Barbara class, taking the place of Donna Pinckney in 2000. During the next decade, she taught or co-taught the class. Polly Holcombe remembers Eileen as her first teacher, explaining skip change with, "Think of being a 6-year-old riding a stick hobby horse."

Eileen was warm and fun-loving, with an insatiable zest for life and for Scottish country dancing. She passed away in Santa Barbara this past October.

A WINNING HORSE


